Dear Friends,

How are we halfway through January already? On Monday we mark the federal holiday honoring Martin Luther King, Jr. As a prominent Civil Rights leader of the 1960s, he used peaceful means to raise awareness that people should be judged by the content of their character and not the color of their skin. He was 39 years old when he was assassinated in 1968, but his legacy remains important today not just in our country but around the world. The rectory office will be closed on Monday, and the daily Mass will be celebrated at 9:30 AM.

I received a donation of \$15,000 towards replacing the kneelers in the church, which covers about half the cost. At a certain point the hardware on the kneelers can't be repaired: parishioners' knees will appreciate new cushions, and it will look nice to have new covers over the cushions. It will take several weeks for the new kneelers to be manufactured and installed. If anyone wishes to contribute, please let me know. I received another donation of \$4,000 back in October to help offset the costs of repainting around the windows and other places that have suffered water damage. I am looking into getting that work done, too. I am grateful for parishioners' love of our parish and their desire to keep it beautiful.

We have added an additional opportunity for Eucharistic Adoration here at St. Luke. Every Saturday we have confessions available from 3:30 to 4:30 PM. We have begun exposing the Blessed Sacrament at 3:30 PM and concluding with benediction at 4:30 PM. We priests are usually busy on Saturdays with the number of people who come for the Sacrament of Penance, and so it seems reasonable to add a period of Eucharistic Adoration at that time to provide a prayerful atmosphere as people go to confession, but also to give more people an opportunity to spend some quiet time with the Lord in prayer. We also do it in response to the Church's desire to celebrate a Eucharistic Revival in our country. Of course, we will continue to offer Eucharistic Adoration on First Fridays from 12:30 PM to 2:00 PM. *Come*, *worship the Lord!* 

We recently met as a staff and we reviewed the Christmas Mass schedule. Obviously, Christmas Eve was very cold this year. We had a huge crowd at the 4:00 PM Children's Mass, and a decent crowd at the 6:00 PM Mass. We propose the possibility of moving the Mass at Night from Midnight to perhaps 10:00 PM. Many people will recall that years ago the church was "standing room only" for Midnight Mass. Those days are long gone. With an aging population in the parish and with concerns for safety in the community, we were wondering if an earlier Mass might be more preferable. I will discuss this at the next Parish Council Meeting, so I raise the issue here to open the conversation among parishioners. At the same time, I wonder if having an earlier Saturday evening Mass in the winter (from Christmas to Easter) at 4:30 PM might be preferable—with the earlier sunsets and the colder nights, there may be some interest among parishioners for an earlier Mass. St. Andrew Avellino changed their Saturday Mass all year long to 4:00 PM and my mom loves it! It doesn't hurt to consider such changes ... I look forward to hearing from parishioners regarding these issues.

I'll be away this week ... you are in good hands with Fr. Chin and Callistus!







### Martin Luther King Jr. Holiday

January 16, 2023

Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. "I Have a Dream" (August 28th., 1963) (Excerpt):

I am not unmindful that some of you have come here out of great trials and tribulations. Some of you have come fresh from narrow jail cells. Some of you have come from areas where your quest for freedom left you battered by the storms of persecution and staggered by the winds of police brutality. You have been the veterans of creative suffering. Continue to work with the faith that unearned suffering is redemptive.

Go back to Mississippi, go back to Alabama, go back to South Carolina, go back to Georgia, go back to Louisiana, go back to the slums and ghettos of our northern cities, knowing that somehow this situation can and will be changed. Let us not wallow in the valley of despair.

I say to you today, my friends, so even though we face the difficulties of today and tomorrow, I still have a dream. It is a dream deeply rooted in the American dream.

I have a dream that one day this nation will rise up and live out the true meaning of its creed: "We hold these truths to be self-evident: that all men are created equal."

I have a dream that one day on the red hills of Georgia the sons of former slaves and the sons of former slave owners will be able to sit down together at the table of brotherhood.

I have a dream that one day even the state of Mississippi, a state sweltering with the heat of injustice, sweltering with the heat of oppression, will be transformed into an oasis of freedom and justice.

I have a dream that my four little children will one day live in a nation where they will not be judged by the color of their skin but by the content of their character.

I have a dream today.

I have a dream that one day, down in Alabama, with its vicious racists, with its governor having his lips dripping with the words of interposition and nullification; one day right there in Alabama, little black boys and black girls will be able to join hands with little white boys and white girls as sisters and brothers.

I have a dream today.

I have a dream that one day every valley shall be exalted, every hill and mountain shall be made low, the rough places will be made plain, and the crooked places will be made straight, and the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together.

This is our hope. This is the faith that I go back to the South with. With this faith we will be able to hew out of the mountain of despair a stone of hope. With this faith we will be able to transform the jangling discords of our nation into a beautiful symphony of brotherhood. With this faith we will be able to work together, to pray together, to struggle together, to go to jail together, to stand up for freedom together, knowing that we will be free one day.

Then we read Good Night Moon, a wonderful winter tale.






## I...is for Ice.....
