Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Friends,

When we celebrate the saints, there are different levels of festivity given to their celebrations. The Nativity of John the Baptist and the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary are *solemnities*, which are the highest level. Both the Gloria and the Nicene Creed are added to the liturgies on those days, even if they fall on a weekday. Next are *feasts*, like the Archangels Gabriel, Michael and Raphael, and the celebrations of the Apostles. Masses celebrating feasts include the Gloria. Next are *obligatory memorials*, like St. Thomas Aquinas and St. Agnes; unless there is a pastoral reason to omit their celebrations, the priest is obliged to remember the saints at Mass. Finally, there are *optional memorials*, like St. Elizabeth of Portugal and St. Maria Goretti. A priest may remember these saints at Mass, or he may choose another Votive Mass or simply use the prayers for the Sundays in Ordinary Time on those saint days.



I bring this up because in 2016, the annual celebration of St. Mary Magdalene was raised from an obligatory memorial to a feast. Pope Francis chose to do so during the special Year of Mercy. He wanted to recognize Mary Magdalene's role as the first witness to Christ's resurrection and as a true and authentic evangelizer. Archbishop Arthur Roche, secretary of the Congregation for

Divine Worship, wrote that in celebrating, "an evangelist who proclaims the central joyous message of Easter," St. Mary Magdalene's feast day is a call for all Christians to, "reflect more deeply on the dignity of women, the new evangelization, and the greatness of the mystery of divine mercy." She is sometimes referred to as an "Apostle to the Apostles," and the Church honors her special relationship with Jesus during his public ministry. The Church celebrates the feast of St. Mary Magdalene each year on July 22nd. *St. Mary Magdalene, pray for us!*

This weekend we turn to the 13th chapter of Matthew's gospel for our reflection. Jesus tells the *Parable of the Sower*, and he explains how, unless seed is sown on rich soil, it will not bear fruit according to its potential: seed sown on rocky ground can't establish proper roots, and seed sown among thorns is choked off. Seed sown on rich soil yields a hundred- or sixty- or thirty-fold. How do we provide rich soil in our hearts for the Word of God? We can do some study of the bible so we



can have a deeper understanding of what we read. We can celebrate the Sacrament of Penance more regularly so we can be in a state of grace as we listen to God's holy Word. We can spend time in prayer and adoration before the Blessed Sacrament so we can express our love for the Lord and receive His love in return. All disciples of the Lord should be concerned about providing rich soil to the Lord so His Word can take root and we can produce much fruit for the benefit of others and for the glory of God.




