I mentioned last week that, as per Bishop Brennan's recommendation, we will count the number of people who attend Mass each weekend to provide parishioners with information that will be brought to deanery and diocesan discussions regarding potential parish partnerships and mergers. To the left you see the data regarding Mass attendance last weekend. Not counting the choir loft, the full seating capacity of the church is about 475. We are also currently in the midst of gathering data for a yearly report recording sacramental celebrations and other ministries that take place here at St. Luke. I will also share that information when the report is complete.

I'm sure all the parish children are ready for Halloween. For the Church, it's All Hallow's Eve ... the Vigil of All Saints Day. We celebrate feasts and memorials of saints all year long, but on November 1st we remember that all of us are called to be saints. One of the core teachings of the Second Vatican Council in Lumen Gentium, the Dogmatic Constitution on the Church, is that there is a Universal Call to Holiness in the Church. Each one of us, as a disciple of the Lord, is called by God to be a witness to His love and mercy in all that we say and do. It was common for St. Paul to refer to the Christians he visited as "saints," so it's not just a designation for those who are in heaven, but all people of faith are counted among the saints.

Thursday is All Souls Day – a time for us to remember all of our departed family members and friends. For some, the grief is more recent; for others, there is an enduring sorrow for having lost loved ones years ago. It is natural for us to recall loved ones who died within the past year, and to seek comfort and consolation from God and from the Church. On Saturday, November 18th, we will celebrate a Mass at Noon to remember all of our parishioners who died since last All Souls Day. All are welcome. I invite you to bring a framed photo of your loved one – no larger than 8 x 10 – for a display of our deceased family members and friends on tables at the front of the church during that Mass. Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen.

Daylight savings ends next weekend, so we put our clocks back one hour before going to bed next Saturday. Of course, nowadays, most of our clocks turn back automatically, but there are always those clocks that need to be turned manually. I'm sure there's more than one parishioner who has a clock that you just don't bother changing because it's too much trouble! We pay for that extra hour of sleep with darker mornings, shorter days, and colder weather settling in. Let's do our best to enjoy the remaining days of 2023!

Tomorrow Bishop Chappetto will depart for the warmer weather in Florida. We pray for his safe travels, and for an enjoyable time with family and friends until he returns to Whitestone next spring!







It may be hard for New Yorkers to believe, but our local winters are warm compared to areas further north where harbor seals spend most of their time.

Seals begin to arrive in the NYC area in November, and can be seen throughout the winter and spring before returning north. The best places for viewing them are on re-
