First Sunday of Advent

Dear Friends,

On this First Sunday of Advent, we begin a new liturgical year. Over the past year we mostly heard from Matthew's gospel; this year we turn to St. Mark. Mark's is the shortest gospel, only 16 chapters long, and is often considered the earliest gospel account. Because the gospel is so short, the Church turns to the 6th chapter of John's gospel, usually over the summer, so we can reflect on the Bread of Life Discourse during the "Year B" cycle of readings. In our passage this weekend, Jesus tells his disciples to be watchful and alert. With this admonition, he sets the stage for this beautiful season of Advent. Among all the things that might distract us in the upcoming weeks, let us remember that our primary task is to keep our focus on Christ as we prepare for Christmas. Watch!

Speaking of gospels, our beloved St. Luke's gospel is 24 chapters long. I've seen suggestions on the Internet that a great way to prepare for Christmas is to read a chapter of Luke's gospel each day during the month of December. Even if you didn't start on Friday, you can make up for lost time and begin now. As a *Theophilus* (lover of God), spending time with God's Word is a great gift we can give to ourselves at any time during the year, but especially during this holy season.

On Friday, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. The Immaculate Mother of God is the patroness of the Diocese of Brooklyn and of the United States of America, and so our devotion to Mary is very important to us. Of course, she is also a key figure during the weeks of Advent. Her availability - *may it be done to me according to your word* – is a model for all disciples, but especially for those who feel called to be a priest, deacon, or a member of consecrated life. Every week in our General Intercessions, we pray for vocations. Let us call upon the Blessed Mother to help those who need some courage to respond to God's call.






