On this Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, we hear about Jonah being sent to Nineveh. It takes three days to walk through the city, but on the first day, when he announces to the people that their city will be destroyed unless they repent, they immediately put on sackcloth and proclaimed a fast. Their response pleases God, and, because they turned from their evil way, God does not destroy the city. While this seems to be a "Lenten theme," we should never tire of hearing the Lord's desire for us to turn away from sin and be faithful to the example of Jesus. In today's gospel passage from Mark, we hear about the call of the first disciples. The two pairs of brothers - Simon & Andrew and James & John - drop their nets and leave everything behind to follow Jesus. Perhaps we need to ask ourselves: "what do I hold onto that prevents me from following the call of the Lord?" Is it pride?

doubt? fear? selfishness? As we mature in the life of faith, we learn that it is best to put our trust in the Lord. If He is truly calling us, He will always provide us with whatever we need to accomplish what he asks of us. Hopefully our New Year's resolutions will help us to be more faithful disciples who are willing to respond to God's call to holiness.

Although the Supreme Court overturned the Roe v. Wade ruling a few years ago, we live in a state that allows abortion through 24 weeks, and later term abortions are permitted for many reasons. The NYC Health web page indicates that one in four women will have an abortion by the age of 45. Prolife proponents continue to participate in the March for Life in Washington, DC, to join their voices to defend the dignity of all human life from conception to natural death. January 22nd is the Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children. I encourage parishioners to make the effort to attend Mass tomorrow, or perhaps even fast or abstain or offer some kind of penitential act to ask God's mercy to protect the unborn and to help all parents to choose life.

On Thursday we celebrate the Conversion of St. Paul. At first, Saul worked tirelessly to persecute Christians because he saw them as a threat to Judaism. Then, on his way to Damascus he met the Lord and his whole life was changed. His name is changed from Saul to Paul, and he becomes the great Apostle to the Gentiles. For many years now, the Church has used the occasion of this feast to pray for Christian Unity. Jesus prayed that we might be one, but, unfortunately, followers of Christ are divided in many ways. I am grateful for the opportunity to support Grace Episcopal Church to stock their food pantry, but we should constantly pray and make every effort to manifest our oneness in Christ. *St. Paul, pray for us!*

Next Sunday we will begin our celebration of Catholic Schools Week at the 10:30 AM Mass. Every year we have the opportunity to promote the benefits of a Catholic School education. In the midst of teaching other academic subjects, a Catholic School also promotes the formation of our students with morals and values that are rooted in our Catholic faith. Each year it becomes more of a challenge to maintain a parish school – costs go up and up, and we could never collect an adequate tuition to pay teachers a salary that properly compensates them for their dedicated service and the sacrifices that they are willing to make to provide a safe environment for learning and faith formation that will sustain the Church in the future. God bless the faculty, staff, and students of St. Luke School!

Dear Family of the Archdiocese of New York,

As I hope you know, I like to keep you updated on significant developments concerning the Archdiocese of New York. Allow me to share some news concerning the location of our central offices in Manhattan.

For over 50 years, the Terence Cardinal Cooke Catholic Building, located at 1011 First Avenue, has served as the central offices of the archdiocese. In addition, Saint John the Evangelist Church shares the building, as did Cathedral Girls High School prior to their move to a new location this past September.

It has been apparent for several years, however, that "1011" no longer made sense as our home. The cost to maintain the physical structure, advances in technology which allow for more remote work, and a desire to be closer to the people we serve throughout the archdiocese, all led us to begin discussions on a possible move, in order to more effectively and efficiently utilize the resources of the archdiocese in service to our people.

As a result, after broad consultation and careful research, a new location has been found at 488 Madison Avenue, next to Saint Patrick's Cathedral, that will house the central offices of the archdiocese. As you may know, the main offices of a diocese are required to be in the See city, that is the city where the diocesan cathedral is located. Not all offices, however, are required to be there, and many offices will move to other locations around the archdiocese, in most cases utilizing existing archdiocesan and parish property, allowing us to be good stewards of our resources.

I am told that 488 Madison Avenue also has a history with the archdiocese, as it was at one time the location of a Catholic Charities orphanage, as well as the former home of Cathedral College Seminary. Its location adjacent to Saint Patrick's Cathedral is another "plus" in its favor.

Although the move to the new location is not planned until sometime in 2025, we will use this intervening time to identify and finalize which offices will move to 488 Madison Avenue, and what locations will be used for other offices.

There have been no decisions on what will happen with 1011 First Avenue, but I will do my best to keep you posted as we move closer to this historic move.


