Dear Friends,



I've shared before the custom of celebrating the feast of Our Lady of Trust on the Sunday before Lent. She is a wonderful intercessor for us as we prepare to enter into the 40 days of prayer, penance, fasting, and almsgiving. In the image, Jesus points to his Mother's Immaculate Heart, reminding us of her great love. It's comforting to know that Mary always accompanies us, and her desire is to lead us to her son, Jesus. As we begin Lent on Ash Wednesday, let us rely on her intercession and love.

With regard to Lent, here are the guidelines for fasting and abstinence:

ABSTINENCE: All the faithful who have reached 14 years of age are required to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday (February 14) and on all the Fridays of the Lenten Season. **FASTING:** All the faithful between the ages of 18 and 59 (inclusive) are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday (March 29) by limiting oneself to one full meal and avoiding food between meals. Light sustenance may be taken on two other occasions during the day. **EASTER DUTY:** After having been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, the faithful are obligated to receive holy Communion at least once a year, this precept to be fulfilled during the Easter Season, unless it is fulfilled at some other time for a good reason. In the United States, the period for fulfilling this precept is extended from the First Sunday of Lent (February 18) until Pentecost Sunday (May 19).

This year I am coming to terms with the fact that, since I turned 60 last year, I am no longer obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Thank God I am healthy enough to continue this penitential practice in my "old age," and so I intend to fast on the prescribed days this Lent anyway.

Here at St. Luke we have the custom of a Lenten series on Tuesdays: gospel sharing after the noon Mass, and then a guest speaker in the evening. Please see the bulletin for more details about our program this year. We also pray Stations of the Cross on Fridays after the noon Mass. The Youth Group will sponsor a Lenten Soup Night on Saturday, March 9th. Bishop Chappetto offered to do a Parish Mission for us, and so that will take place during the week of March 17. Reconciliation Monday will take place on Monday, March 25th. Let us pray that this holy season will help all of us to grow in God's grace!

To the Clergy, Staffs, and Faithful of Deanery Queens 4,

On Tuesday, October 10th, Bishop Brennan met with the priests of your deanery to discuss the current pastoral situation in the parishes so we can begin to plan for the best way to continue to evangelize and proclaim the Gospel in your deanery while facing the reality of limited personnel and resources.

Some information that we shared includes:

- The deanery is comprised of 9 parishes in all of College Point and Whitestone, and most
 of Flushing.
- Mass is celebrated in 6 languages in addition to English: the Spanish and Chinese communities are growing; the Italian communities are declining in numbers. A small community gathers for Mass in Urdu twice a month; Mass in Tagalog is celebrated monthly in two parishes. The Korean community is served at St. Paul Chong HaSang.
- The Chinese community is moving further east from downtown Flushing.
- Many Korean families have moved away from Flushing but return to St. Paul Chong HaSang for Mass.
- Most of the priests serving in the deanery are foreign-born; several senior priests live in the rectories and assist as needed.

In addition to the information that was shared, some concerns raised by the priests include:

- There is not a sufficient pool of trained lay leaders to fill the roles of Religious Education Directors and other pastoral ministries in our parishes.
- · As older parishioners die off or move away, non-Catholics are buying their homes.
- The cost of running a parish continues to increase, making it more of a challenge to balance budgets and provide for the spiritual needs of the community.

I share the notes of the meeting with you so that you are aware of some of the more immediate concerns that your pastors are facing. In the months ahead, they will continue to work together and provide opportunities for parishioners to be a part of the discussion so that Bishop Brennan can make decisions that will first and foremost help us to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ most effectively, while at the same time minimize the administrative burdens that can detract from the important work of the Church in your part of northern Queens.



I am confident that with Mary's intercession and a spirit of collaboration and charity among all of us, we will make decisions that will help us plan for a vibrant future for the Church in Brooklyn and Queens.
