Traditionally the last two weeks of Lent are known as *Passiontide*. This final period of the forty days has us focus on the suffering Christ as we draw near to the Sacred Triduum. Next Sunday is Palm Sunday, and many visitors will join us for Mass. You may have to park a little further away, and the pews will be more crowded than usual, but hopefully our welcome and our patience will bear fruit in some people returning to the regular practice of the faith.

If you will be coming to our celebration of the Mass of the Lord’s Supper on Holy Thursday, please consider offering to have your feet washed. We need about 12 individuals or members of families to take part in the ritual to remind us of the humble example of Jesus as he gathered with his apostles for the Last Supper. If you are interested, please email office@stlukewhitestone.org.

Last weekend Fr. Fonti, the pastor of St. Mel, and I printed the same letter in our bulletins regarding Mass schedule changes. As you know, Bishop Brennan is trying to deal with the reality of a diminishing number of priests and other resources in parishes. For four weekends each year parishes are asked to submit data regarding Mass attendance. The diocese is looking at the church capacity as a measure for determining how many Masses should be celebrated in parishes. Language needs and the schedules of parishes in the wider community are also considered. Our two parishes are fortunate to have 3 senior priests who are able to assist with celebrating Mass, but at the same time only 3 priests are assigned to minister at St. Mel and St. Luke, and both pastors have diocesan responsibilities outside of our parishes. Change is never easy, but I pray that parishioners both here and at St. Mel will adapt to the changes. We will likely eventually go through a process of collaboration and partnership at some point in the future, which will require further adaptations to schedules and personnel. This Jubilee Year reminds us that we are pilgrims of hope. We place our trust in the Lord and rely on Him to provide for all our needs.

On this 5th Sunday of Lent we hear the account of the woman who was caught “in the very act of committing adultery.” The people brought their accusations to Jesus, who listened and then wrote on the ground. When they persisted, he straightened up and said to them, “Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her.” One by one, they went away. With no one to condemn her, Jesus offers her forgiveness and says, “Go, and from now on do not sin any more.” This passage reminds us that we are sinners who sometimes easily judge others while forgetting our own sinfulness. Perhaps we want the focus off of ourselves to ease the shame of our sins. When we pray the Lord’s prayer, we ask: “forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us.” If we wish to be forgiven by God, then we need to be people who forgive others. There’s still time during this Lent to make a difference!


Intentions Mass

Fr. Patrick Flanagan, is the youngest of a family of five and originally from St. Frances de Chantal in Wantagh, Long Island. Following priestly ordination, Fr. Flanagan was a Parochial Vicar at Immaculate Conception in the Germantown section of Philadelphia, and science teacher at Merion Mercy Academy from 1992 to 1994. He served as Campus Minister and adjunct instructor at his alma mater, Niagara University, from 1994 to 1998. From 1998 to 2003, he was a doctoral student at Loyola University Chicago while living with his Vincentian confreres at DePaul University. Fr. Flanagan currently serves as Chair and Associate Professor in the Department of Theology and Religious Studies at St. John's University, where he has been missioned for the past 21 years.
