

This is the last week of the Easter Season. Forty days brought us to Ascension Thursday, and we are now in the midst of the final ten days before Pentecost. Come Holy Spirit! Veni Sancte Spiritus! The whole Church prays in a special way for a renewal of the Holy Spirit in the life of the Church. The promised Counselor remains with the Church always, which means that each and every one of us are blessed with the presence of the Holy Spirit in our hearts, and so we call upon the gifts of wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety and fear of the Lord to help us as we humbly serve God and one another.

On this seventh Sunday of Easter, we hear the story of Saint Stephen, the first martyr. We celebrate his feast day on the day after Christmas every year. The first thing to note is that Stephen is filled with the Spirit. Like the apostles and the other disciples, Stephen is strengthened to give witness to Jesus by the power of the Holy Spirit. The crowd rushes after him, leads him out of the city, and begins to stone him to death. He calls out, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit." Just before his death, he cried out in a loud voice, "Lord, do not hold this sin against them," which reminds us of the words of Jesus before He died on the cross. There is an expression: the blood of the martyrs is the seed of the Church. The seeds that Stephen planted with his blood two millennia ago continue to be joined by seeds of Christian martyrs in our own day. Just like we remember and honor the sacrifices made by our fellow Americans on Memorial Day, every day we have the opportunity to remember and honor the example and witness of the holy martyrs, who inspire us to be faithful disciples of the Lord.

As I write this the weather forecast is mixed for the Carnival, but I hope that overall it will be a successful and fun event for our community. I am grateful to Sabato Daniele, Jennifer Daniele, and a host of assistants and volunteers who worked so hard behind the scenes in the weeks before the Carnival to make sure that everything would come together for a great parish celebration. Of course, we can't help but think of Sal Colak and Msgr. Tosi as the Carnival returns this year. Their love and support of St. Luke are fondly remembered as we enjoy these days. God bless St. Luke Parish!

As you know, Deacon Callistus Ibeh and Deacon Juan Herrera will be ordained priests for the Diocese of Brooklyn on Saturday, June 28th. Many parishioners have been invited to the ordination, so we will rent a school bus to make transportation to the Co-Cathedral of St. Joseph easier for those who were invited to attend. Since there are seven men to be ordained this year, the diocese is concerned that invited guests will be accommodated inside the Co-Cathedral. Of course, the ordination will be broadcast live on NET TV, and Fr. Callistus Ibeh will celebrate a Mass of Thanksgiving here at St. Luke on Sunday, June 29th. Hopefully we can also arrange for Fr. Juan Herrera to celebrate a Mass here at St. Luke, too. In the meantime, let's keep all those to be ordained in our prayers, that God will bless them abundantly as they prepare to serve as priests in Brooklyn and Queens.

For Feeding God's People!

The **St. Luke Youth Group** would like to thank everyone who donated to the collection we took up for the St. Michael's kitchen. With your generosity, we raised \$3,000 to help feed some of God's people who are experiencing a rough time. The volunteers at St. Michael's were thrilled to have our members there assisting them, and are so very thankful to all of you for your support and prayers.



Below are some of the thoughts from our students on their experience that day ...

I had the opportunity to go to St. Michael's and help out in the kitchen. First, we prepared trays of hot food on an assembly line. The meals were then bagged up with a few other items and ready to be handed out. All 90 or so meals were handed out to members of the community that are in need. Mothers showed up with their children as did some elderly people and young people too.

I felt honored that I was able to help prepare these meals and put a smile on people's faces. One of the special parts of the day is when we prayed before the meals were handed out. Today taught me to appreciate everything I have and most importantly not take what I have for granted. -R. H.





St. Michaels has provided me with the opportunity to serve those in need by feeding them, and this has really opened my eyes. What at first looked like a simple service opportunity of meal distribution turned out to be much more a lesson in empathy and respect. The people who came to pick up the meals were not only hungry but starved for good treatment, and proper recognition. Their faces reminded me about how much we ignore how much poverty also constitutes a lack of acknowledgement and resources. At St Michaels, we were not simply providing food but giving out appreciation and acceptance to provide a safe space. -S.S.



Today was a day that I will not forget for many years to come. We all got together early in the morning, not for a party or anything to celebrate, but to do something that truly mattered: we prepared and served a meal for the homeless. At first I didn't know what to expect. I wondered if it would feel uncomfortable, or maybe even overwhelming. But the moment we started working stirring pots, arranging plates, I felt a quiet sense of purpose settle over all of us. It wasn't just about the food. It was about the care that went into every meal, the smiles we hoped to spark and the dignity we wanted to restore.







