Dear Friends,

Today is Mother's Day, and so we honor and celebrate our mothers, grandmothers, godmothers, and all the mother figures in our lives. For those of us who are still blessed to have our mothers with us, we give thanks for the countless ways our mothers care for us and show us their love. For those whose mothers have passed away, we pray for the Lord's mercy to welcome them home to heaven so they can intercede for us and watch over us. For those with troubled relationships with their mothers, we pray for the healing of God's grace. Happy Mother's Day!

As you know, the month of May is dedicated to the Blessed Mother. There are so many resources on the Internet to help people to pray the Rosary. It is a simple and powerful prayer, and the mysteries of the Rosary help us to reflect on important moments in the life and ministry of Jesus. *Ad Iesum per Mariam ... to Jesus through Mary!*

This week we reach the 40th day of the Easter Season as we celebrate Ascension Thursday. Jesus ascends to heaven and leaves the early community with the promise of the Advocate who will remain with the Church always. The Easter Season concludes after 50 days with the celebration of Pentecost, and we are renewed as disciples through the abiding presence of the Holy Spirit. The days between Ascension Thursday and Pentecost should be considered as a novena of prayer for the Holy Spirit. A traditional prayer to the Holy Spirit can be prayed each day:

Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and enkindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth. O, God, who by the light of the Holy Spirit, did instruct the hearts of the faithful, grant that by the same Holy Spirit we may be truly wise and ever enjoy His consolations, through Christ Our Lord, Amen.

I know that we are all tired of wearing masks and keeping social distance, but it is important for us all to follow the guidelines when we gather for Mass until the city changes the protocols. Ushers remind people to sanitize their hands and to wear masks when they arrive. Unfortunately, not everyone who comes to church easily complies. Ushers are volunteers and try their best to encourage people to follow the rules, and I am sure that no one wants a public confrontation to take place between ushers and parishioners while people are praying during Mass. It sounds like better days are ahead, but I urge all parishioners who worship here at St. Luke to be charitable in their attitudes and to do what is asked for the sake of the safety of all of us.

Praying the Rosary

Familiarize yourself and/or your group with the prayers of the rosary.

The Rosary is a Scripture-based prayer.

It begins with the *Apostles' Creed*, which summarizes the great mysteries of the Catholic faith.

The Our Father, which introduces each mystery, is from the Gospels.

The first part of the *Hail Mary* is the angel's words announcing Christ's birth and Elizabeth's greeting to Mary.

St. Pius V officially added the second part of the *Hail Mary*.

The Mysteries of the Rosary center on the events of Christ's life.

There are four sets of Mysteries: Joyful, Sorrowful, Glorious and—added by Saint John Paul II in 2002—the Luminous.



THE PRAYERS OF THE ROSARY

1. Make the Sign of the Cross.
2. Holding the Crucifix, say the *Apostles' Creed*.
3. On the first bead, say an *Our Father*.
4. Say one *Hail Mary* on each of the next three beads.
5. Say the *Glory Be*
6. For each of the five decades, announce the Mystery (perhaps followed by a brief reading from Scripture) then say the *Our Father*.
7. While fingering each of the ten beads of the decade, next say ten Hail Marys while meditating on the Mystery. Then say a *Glory Be*. (After finishing each decade, some say the following prayer requested by the Blessed Virgin Mary at Fatima:
O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell; lead all souls to Heaven, especially those who have most need of your mercy.)
8. After saying the five decades, say the Hail, Holy Queen, followed by this dialogue and prayer:
V. Pray for us, O holy Mother of God.
R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.
Let us pray: O God, whose Only Begotten Son, by his life, Death, and Resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life, grant, we beseech thee, that while meditating on these mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
(A [prayer to St. Joseph](#) may also follow.)
Conclude the Rosary with the Sign of the Cross.

FATHER KEVIN CREAGH, CM CELEBRATES 25 YEARS of PRIESTHOOD



We rejoice with Father Kevin Creagh, CM, as he celebrates 25 years of priesthood on May 25, 2021.

Father Creagh, who is known by many in our parish, is a graduate of St. Luke School and Holy Cross High School. After two years in the Marines, he attended St. John's University and the Diocesan Seminary in Huntington.

During the last twenty-five years, Father Creagh has been assigned to many locations and has engaged in a variety of ministries. Among them are teaching at Niagara University, serving as a missionary in Taiwan, and holding an administrative position at St. John's University. After a Doctorate from the University of Pennsylvania, he was appointed President-rector of Christ the King Seminary in Buffalo, NY. He is currently serving as Vicar for Religious in the Diocese of Buffalo.

Father Kevin has also managed return visits to Whitestone for the purpose of officiating at the sacramental celebrations of his family and former classmates.

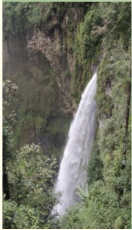
Judy Moody Saves the World!
